Selective High School Placement Test - Year 7 2015

If you would like your child to apply for selective high school placement in Year 7 in 2015, you need to do so soon. Most applicants are expected to apply on the internet and submit the application online. To do this you need to have an email address, access to the internet and a printer.

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from 15 October 2013 at www.schools.nsw.edu.au/shsplacement Online applications close on 18 November 2013.

If you do not have internet access, commercially printed application forms will be available at school from 22 October. They must be completed and returned to school by 18 November 2013.

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 13 March 2014.

Dear Parents and Carers

Over the next few weeks the students in Stages 2 and 3 are reciting a well-known poem for their library assessment task. In library time they have practised reading their poem and need more opportunities to recite in front of others. Ask to hear their poem, praise their efforts and encourage them to tell you what the poem is about. Research has repeatedly shown that paying attention to the language and rhythms of poetry helps build oral language skills. Children with well-developed oral language skills are more likely to have higher achievement in reading and writing.


