



Wow! What a busy term we have had so far! In Week 2 we participated in the Athletics Carnival. We had a fun-filled day taking part in races and tabloid games. The highlight for Year 2 children was joining in the "tug of war" rope activity. That certainly tested the muscles! A big thank you to the parents who came along and helped with the activities.

Then we had our Open Day! We loved dancing and singing for the large group of parents and friends who came to watch. It was great to have visitors in our classrooms to see how we work.

Our next fabulous event was the excursion to The Coastal Environment Centre at Narrabeen. Here we participated in lots of activities designed to teach us about caring for the environment. The walk over the headland to Turimetta Beach was awesome (as the





children like to say) and we all agreed with Malaki's statement..."Man, what a view!"

Science Week



What a week I have had a Brookvale Public School! I always choose to visit Brookvale because the students are SO clever and engaged!!



Last week was National Science Week. The theme this year celebrates 100 years of Australian science. To celebrate, Brookvale has been busy researching information for their daily science quiz! I was up ALL night marking these quizzes because I received so many great answers! Each stage had the opportunity to investigate air and space, electricity and matter, plants and animals, earth and its surroundings and the human body.

Now Science Week wouldn't be fun without a good dose

of experimentation! The student's observed three experiments. We discovered that when a Mentos lolly is mixed with diet coke, 'nucleation' occurs because of the 'craters' (holes) in the Mentos. Carbon dioxide is formed and explodes out of the bottle!

The second experiment involved hydrogen peroxide and yeast. We made elephants toothpaste!! We learnt that the hydrogen and oxygen are best friends in hydrogen peroxide but the yeast comes to break them apart! Oh no!

The third experiment involved a rocket! We made a rocket out of a film canister using vinegar and bicarbonate of soda. Too much carbon dioxide was produced inside the film canister so it burst open and shot up like a rocket! What fun!!!
