With the introduction of the new Australian Curriculum our teachers have been undertaking an extensive range of professional learning opportunities to ensure that our staff has the knowledge and expertise to teach the content of the new syllabuses, ensuring the best outcomes for all.

Miss Skye Surrest and Ms Maria Kortekaas have recently initiated and established a network for the Assistant Principals from the twelve schools in the Northern Beaches Learning Alliance. They held a meeting here in our library that was attended by Mr Dean White (Director, Public Schools) and a visiting academic from Finland. This network will enable the Assistant Principals of the twelve schools to work collaboratively together developing programs and sharing resources.

Yesterday Miss Surrest, Ms Kortekaas and I attended the *Asia Literate Conference* together. We came away feeling inspired by the three keynote speakers and with a deeper knowledge of intercultural understanding and of the opportunities that will be available to young people through developing links with Asian countries. Our young students will certainly have a head start by acquiring the ability to converse in Mandarin.

Our school has also become a local centre of learning as we continue to host a range of workshops for our own and visiting teachers.


There are some really good morals in the story like one person can make a big difference, if you litter, others might follow; and never give up on helping
