During the last week of Term 3, groups of Stage 3 students who had been working on *Natural Disaster* research reports in library time were able to make their presentations to the class. Over the last nine weeks they had learned about the NSW information search process which gave them a model to structure their research. The NSW model involves the following steps:

Defining: What do the words mean? What do I have to find out?

Locating: Where will I find the information? Students were shown how to use both print and online sources (*World Book* online and other sites). Selecting: What's the big idea? What are the details to support this? Students were given a strategy.

Organising: How am I going to put this information together?


Presenting: How will I share this information? Evaluating: What have we learned together?
