From The Principal

Term Invoices

Term invoices will be sent out this week; please check your child's bag to ensure that you receive it. We always try to keep school costs as low as possible, whilst also ensuring that our students have a range of high quality opportunities to enhance their learning and social development.

Thank you to all the families who pay their invoices promptly, this is much appreciated and is a great help for our accounting procedures.

In Term 4 all students will be offered swimming lessons (K-4) or surf education and kayaking lessons (5-6). These lessons cost approximately \$100 per child and are paid for with P&C funds. The only cost to families is for bus transport.

On the last day of the school year we will have our traditional 'picnic day' for all students K-6. This year we are going to Manly Ocean World for an educational tour, followed by fun and games at the beach. This excursion will cost \$17.

If you are experiencing difficulty paying school invoices, it is important that you let me know. This year we have an unusually high number of payments outstanding, with no notification. The school cannot continue to maintain this as all our funds are committed to teacher and support staff salaries and teaching resources.

Over the course of a typical 40 week school year, expenses at our school average at less than \$10 per week per student. This includes text books, stationery, excursions, incursions, performances, swimming and surfing lessons, sport, gymnastics, dance and Life Education.

Unfortunately we now have to say that if payment is not received in advance for excursions and special programs, and notification has not been received by me, children will be unable to participate.

Selective High School Placement Test – Year 7 2015

If you would like your child to apply for selective high school placement in Year 7 in 2015, you need to do so soon. Most applicants are expected to apply on the internet and submit the application online. To do this you need to have an email address, access to the internet and a printer.

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from 15 October 2013 at www.schools.nsw.edu.au/shsplacement Online applications close on 18 November 2013.

If you do not have internet access, commercially printed application forms will be available at school from 22 October. They must be completed and returned to school by 18 November 2013.

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 13 March 2014.
