Library News

Afternoon tea in the library continues at 2.45pm every Wednesday afternoon. Come in for a cuppa on those cold afternoons. Browse or swap a book, have a snack.

Where is the Book Swap? We have two shelves of adult fiction and non-fiction books just inside the library door.

How does it work? Take a book for your own enjoyment and replace it with another when you have finished reading it. You do not have to return the same book. Pass it on, talk about it, and let your children see you talking about books.

Conditions: To encourage participation this is a 'one goes in, one goes out' arrangement. Take a book and then next time you pop in, add one to our collection. (Doesn't matter what – it could be a magazine, it could be in another language). Speaking of which.....

It is important for school libraries to have materials in which children can see themselves, to read literature relating to their own lives and families, to feel valued as part of the school culture which will in turn increase their social and academic success. Patton (2008)

As well as building a sense of belonging, security and confidence, Agosto (2007) argues that multicultural resources are especially valuable with the English language acquisition process.
