Chickenpox

There have reportedly been a few cases of chickenpox lately, both around the Northern Beaches and in our school community. Chickenpox is a viral illness that begins with a sudden onset of slight fever, runny nose, feeling generally unwell and a skin rash. According to New South Wales Government Health, people are infectious from one or two days before the rash appears (that is, during the fever/runny nose phase) and up to five days after (when the blisters have formed crusts or scabs). The infection is highly contagious to people who have never had chickenpox or who have not been vaccinated. Early in the illness, the virus is spread by coughing so we

advise you to keep your child at home if they experience the initial symptoms as a safety precaution.


Around the Stages - Stage 2

Stage 2 continues to be an exciting group to be part of! Congratulations to those students in Stage 2 who made it to the Zone Swimming Carnival! Well done to Elwyn, Vivian and Rueban. We know you made our school proud!

The students are finishing off their science topic "Melting Moments". They have been melting chocolate and freezing various items. The students have been investigating the melting points of different

materials and developing an understanding that not everything melts at the same temperature.





Stage 2 has been looking at the Early Australian Explorers. The Portuguese and the Dutch came to look for the "Great Southern Land" and found parts of the west coast, but it was Captain Cook who discovered the east coast. Take a look at this timeline of Captain Cook's life that Tasnia produced!

We have learnt that 18 years after Captain Cook, Captain Arthur Phillip and the First Fleet came to Sydney and started a new British colony. We are in the process of uncovering the devastating consequences

that this 'invasion' had on the Aboriginal people of Australia who

were already here for fifty thousand years! The Aboriginal people of Australia are still affected today as a result of these actions. We're very excited about our excursion to the Maritime Museum on <u>Wednesday 2nd April 2014</u>. We will be visiting Captain Cook's ship, the Endeavour, to see what life was like at sea. We will then have a





guided tour of the museum to learn about early Aboriginal Life. It's very exciting, so get your payment and permission notes in <u>THIS WEEK</u>. There are several important dates for your diary coming up between now and the end of term......



Courageous Kids - Support for Anxious Children

Courageous Kids is a practical and effective anxiety prevention and self-esteem program run by experienced Child Psychologist, Robyn Fallshaw. It helps kids aged 6-8 to cope with feelings of fear, worry and depression and provides families with practical strategies for home and school.

- Courageous Kids runs on Friday afternoons from 3.45pm to 4.45pm during school terms.
- It is a 9 week program for small groups of up to 6 children
- Detailed resources for children and families are provided each week
- Parents are invited to attend the last ten minutes of each session so that ideas and strategies for home and school can be shared.
- A 30 minute consultation with Psychologist, Robyn Fallshaw, is included half way through the term so that parents can discuss their child's specific challenges and progress in private.
- Courageous Kids is a health service and is eligible for Medicare and health fund rebates.

Preliminary parent interviews to determine if Courageous Kids is the appropriate clinical option for children are taking place now and bookings for Term 2, 2014 are currently open.


